### Problem 1 (50 points)

Civil engineering undergraduate students collected airport noise data in the summer of 2015 as part of a study abroad program (see Figure 1). Airport noise is important to mitigate environmental impacts around airports.

The data collected came from two noise recording instruments that recorded the information independently but during the same time period. A data file with the data collected is provided. The information in the file includes the instrument (Casela 240 or Casela 340), the time of day of the recording (in decimal hours) and the A-weighted equivalent continuous sound level (LAeq) in decibels - a measure of the noise produced by the aircraft. A screen capture of the data provided is shown below.

- a) Create a Matlab script to read the data. Label the variables appropriately and include their units if applicable as part of the variable name.
- b) Add code to the Matlab script created in part (a) to plot the LAeq noise levels (as a function of time) recorded by the Casela 240 instrument (top plot) and the Casela 340 (bottom plot). Use the subplot command to partition the figure into two plots.
- c) Add code to calculate the difference between every record of LAeq recorded by the Casela 240 and the Casela 340 instruments. Plot the difference as a function of time.
- d) Calculate the mean and the standard deviation (using Matlab) of the difference in LAeq values recorded by both instruments.
- e) Create a histogram of the difference produced by both instruments.
- f) Find the number of times (in a 24-hour period) the noise level exceeds 60 dBA using the Casela 340 instrument.

## Problem 2 (50 points)

The ACME company makes \$850 for every metric ton of concrete mix of type A delivered. The company makes \$900 for every metric ton of concrete mix of type B delivered. After formulating the problem as an optimization problem to maximize the revenue for the ACME company, the engineers produce the following linear programming problem.

$$\text{Max } Z = 850x_1 + 900x_2$$

subject to:

$$x_2 \leq 85$$

$$260x_1 + 300x_2 \leq 41000$$

$$130x_1 + 350x_2 \leq 36000$$

$$350x_1 + 190x_2 \leq 43000$$

$$x_1 \text{ and } x_2 \geq 0$$

a) Convert the problem shown above into **standard (canonical) form** to be solved by hand using the Simplex Method. Write down the transformed equations and add slack variables as needed.

$$\text{Max } Z - 850x_1 - 900x_2 = 0$$

subject to:

$$x_2 + x_3 = 85$$

$$260x_1 + 300x_2 + x_4 = 41000$$

$$130x_1 + 350x_2 + x_5 = 36000$$

$$350x_1 + 190x_2 + x_6 = 43000$$

b) Find the optimal solution to the problem using the manual Simplex Method (tables and row operations) explained in class. Indicate the numerical values of all decision variables in every table. Indicate the value of the objective function Z in every table. This task requires calculations and row operations and you need to show me your row operations clearly.

c) Solve the problem using Excel Solver. Verify the solution obtained in part (a).

d) Show a graphical solution to the problem indicating the corner points. In the plot also show 2-3 lines of constant Z value (your choice of Z-values).
